Minutes for Medina Ridgeway Shelby Consolidation Study Committee 18 January 2011 6:30 PM

Meeting came to order at 6:35 PM.

Charles Zettek of CGR began the meeting with an overview of subcommittee reports. The purpose of this meeting was not to talk about how these subcommittee reports fit together – that is for the next meeting (February 16, 6:30 PM). He instead gave a big picture view of each report, with specifics to be addressed by subcommittee members (if needed).

Five subcommittees were established, they were: (1) Economic Development, (2) Police, (3) DPW, (4) Fire/Ambulance, and (5) Building Usage. The subcommittees determined that some options for consolidation do not make sense given tax and service impacts and other details specific to the village and towns being considered. They are:

- 1. Dissolve Village, leaving 2 Towns intact
- 2. Keep the Village as a whole, combine 2 Towns

Viable options are still:

- 1. Heightened, shared services: i.e., 3 governments work together through intermunicipal agreements
- 2. Consolidation of all 3 governments into a single entity
  - a. Either as a Town
  - b. Or as a City

Recommendations based on (subcommittees considering/focusing upon):

- 1. Cost efficiencies
- 2. Community benefits

Specific Subcommittee Reports were then reviewed in more detail. With regard to the Economic Development Subcommittee, Charlie Slack made a motion to send a memo to the state outlining any questions the full committee may have about the impact on the NCWD agreement under a consolidated government model. Nathan Pace seconded the motion.

Questions that came up during the detailed review of reports were addressed by CGR representatives or subcommittee members. A more in depth discussion of subcommittee reports will be held during our next meeting, Feb. 16 at 6:30 PM.
