The Dissolution Committee has been responsible for investigating the effects of village Dissolution on cost, taxation, services (including shared services), employment, land use, common economic development and community development. Consideration is given to both village residents and town–outside village residents. Alternatives are considered to dissolution as well as seeking extensive public input. All of the committee’s work is open to the public and follows the NYS Open Meetings Law. The meeting minutes are recorded and approved, the website is available to all regarding the work to date. The committee serves on behalf of the Village Board of Trustees. The committee provides monthly progress reports to the Village Board of Trustees. The committee members are **not** permitted to make a recommendation on dissolution; only to report our findings. The minutes are recorded, approved and posted on the website listed at the bottom of the newsletter. Copies of the draft plan and presentation will be available in the Village Hall in October.
